

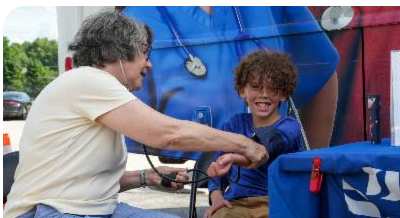

POSITIVE ACTION AT THE CLUB: GATE CITY KEYSTONE



Positive Action is a structured, age-appropriate program offered at the Club that supports social-emotional learning, character development, and healthy decision-making. It is an evidence-based program designed for our Club members that uses engaging lessons rooted in timeless principles to connect education, prevention, mental health, and family support.

This month, we're highlighting our **Gate City Keystone!** Gate City Keystone provides leadership development opportunities for young people ages 14 to 18. Recently, members took part in the 4-H Day of Service, joining nearly 200 families and volunteers in a community-wide effort to make a difference. Together, participants raised over \$2,100 and collected 700 pounds of food to support **End 68 Hours of Hunger**, helping provide meals for children facing food insecurity over weekends and school breaks. Their efforts reflect the power of youth leadership in action and the impact of coming together to support our community.
